

Felt Binoculars

Supplies

Assorted 9"x12" Craft Cuts of Kunin Classic, Premium, and Corduroy Felt in Various Colors
(Shown are Classic in Apple Green and Walnut, Premium in Pirate Green, and Corduroy in Cashmere Tan)

- 1 – Sizzix Die-Cut Machine
- 1 – Pet Shop Collection Set of Dies
- 1 – Pair of Scissors
- 1 – Bottle of Felt Glue
- 2 – Cardboard Tubes, Any Length (2 tubes per pair of binoculars)
- 1 – Skein of Yarn



Directions

1. Glue two cardboard tubes together. (Figure A)
2. Punch a hole in each tube to create a place to eventually tie in yarn. Next, cut a piece of felt that fits the length of the tubes and wraps around them completely. Use felt glue to adhere it to the tubes. (Figure B)
3. Add yarn by tying it through the holes in the tubes – 30 inches works great for most kiddos to be able to hang their binoculars around their necks. (Figure C)
4. Decorate your binoculars with felt die-cuts. The frog, dragonfly, snake, and lizard are all from my Laura Kelly Pet Shop collection available from Sizzix. (Figure D)
